#### Our Rules

- 1. All instructions from show officials and stewards must be obeyed.
- 2. The judge's decision is final.
- 3. Any objections must be made to the Secretary in writing within 15 minutes of the incident. A £10 deposit will be taken and returned if the objection is upheld.
- 4. The organisers reserve the right to cancel or alter any class without prior notice.
- 5. No entry money will be refunded.
- 6. Anyone entering the show premises or using any of the facilities does so entirely at their own risk. The landowners and organisers are not responsible and do not accept any liability for any loss or damage to persons, animals, vehicles or property howsoever caused.
- 7. No galloping on the show field. Please use the designated warmup ring.
- 8. All riders must wear properly fitted protective headgear that includes a permanently fitted non-detachable retaining harness that must be securely fastened. Hats must comply with the PAS 015:2011 with BSI Kitemark, VG1 with BSI Kitemark, Snell E2016 onwards with the official Snell label and number, ASTM-F1163 2004a onwards with the SEI mark, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards. Hard hats must also be worn by all exhibitors 14 years and under in all in hand classes. Suitable heeled footwear must be worn when mounted.
- 9. Entire males over 1 year of age must be bitted and kept under control at all times. They must not be exhibited by competitors under 14 years of age.
- 10. No horse or pony under 4 years of age may be ridden on the show field.
- 11. Riders/handlers ages are as of 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024.
- 12. Dogs must be kept on leads at all times.
- 13. Please dispose of your litter carefully and take it home with you as the show field is used for grazing.
- 14. Riders who have entered the lead rein class may also enter the first ridden class in order for them to gain confidence to go it alone.
- 15. Horses and ponies entered into mountain & moorland classes must be shown in their natural state. Part-breds may be shown plaited.
- 16. If you arrive for your class late and it has already started, then it is the judge's decision whether you can enter the class. If you are not permitted to enter the class, then you are not entitled to a refund of your entry money.
- 17. It is the competitor's responsibility to make sure they are on time for their class. The show organisers take no responsibility for announcing the start of each class. It is strongly recommended competitors wait by their ring to ensure they are on time for their class starting.
- 18. Riders/handlers must be over 4 years of age.
- 19. This list of rules is not exhaustive.
- 20. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- 21. Entry for classes will close during the prize giving of the previous class.

#### Signing of the entry form will be deemed as acceptance of these rules.

We are all volunteers who have an interest in encouraging all abilities to take part in the showing and equestrian world with an emphasis on having fun. Ring 1 Showjumping

10am start

#### Clear round

This is a non-competitive class. You can complete the course in your own time, with help if required. There are no placings in the clear round class but anyone who goes clear will be awarded a clear round rosette. There is no limit to how many times you enter a clear round class. Clear round can be used as a warmup/practice before each competitive showjumping class. Clear round costs £3.50 a round or two rounds for £5 and you can pay at the gate.

Class 2A	Clear Round Approx 30cm
Class 2	<b>True Beginner</b> Approx 30-36cm 1 timed round Under 12 years divided into assisted and independently ridden
Class 3A	Clear Round Approx 40cm
Class 3	<b>Joker Class</b> This class will change for each show. We will release the class details on the club Facebook page at least 7 days prior to the show.
Class 4A	Clear Round Approx 50cm
Class 4	<b>Extremely Novice</b> Approx 40-50cm 1 timed round Divided into under 16yrs and over 16yrs.
Class 5A	Clear Round Approx 60cm
Class 5	Mini Novice Individual Approx 60cm 1 timed round.
Class 6A	Clear Round Approx 70cm
Class 6	Novice Individual Approx 70cm 1 timed round

Rider & horse combinations may not enter more than two consecutive classes (This does not include clear round)

Clear round will run for <u>up to</u> 30 minutes before each class.

#### Ring 3Keep Smiling Classes

These classes are open to all. They are open to all breeds/colours/heights and ages of horses and ponies both in hand and ridden. The classes are aimed at anyone new to showing, nervous riders, horses with scars and blemishes, young stock and horses that do not fit in other classes. Any tack or turnout is welcome as you will not be judged on this. You are welcome to bring a maximum of two helpers in the ring with you. Competitors may start the class ridden but are welcome to dismount and carry on in hand if they need to. Ridden competitors will not be required to canter unless they wish to. The judge will be there to encourage and support competitors and offer advice and assistance as required.

This class will not be placed but each competitor will receive a specially commissioned rosette.
